Grade levels—Jr. High and High School

Description: *This class is equivalent to 2.0 credits.* It covers all Speech and Debate requirements with a focus on Civics, for 2.0 credits (1.0 Speech and 1.0 Debate)

It can be used as a Civics credit for those who already took Speech.

For those using it as an English credit, all speeches and debates are written and typed. Credits would be 1.0 for Speech and 1.0 for English, no credit for debate, since that unit will be used for persuasive writing. This class will cover all elements of Speech and Debate but will focus on civics for English and Debate/Speech topics.

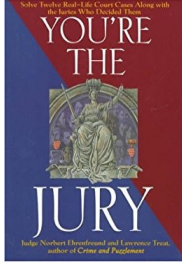
