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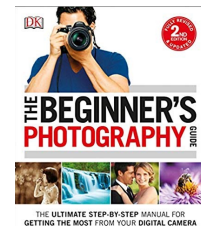

Course Description: In this course, students will learn the foundation of digital photography, primarily focused on photos produced from natural light sources. Topics covered, but not limited to, are a brief history of photography, how to use your camera, modes and settings, aperture, shutter speed, ISO, composition, finding and using natural light, posing subjects, and using photo editing software to improve images. In addition to weekly take-home assignments, the class will be allowed to go outside or to other locations on campus to practice what is presented in class each week. The students will learn how to analyze and critique each other's photos not only to improve their own skills, but to give useful information for other students to improve theirs. **THIS IS A ONE-SEMESTER COURSE (.5 Credit)**
